Paradise Pow Wow 2014 July 12 And July 13 At Gold Nugget Museum

The Paradise Pow Wow is a two day event that began in 1996. This traditional, Native American gathering is held each year on the beautiful park like setting at the Gold Nugget Museum, 502 Pearson Road, Paradise, California. .

This year the Paradise Pow Wow will be held on Saturday, July 12 from 10 AM to 8 PM and on Sunday, July 13 from 10 AM to 5 PM. Indian Pow Wows are held throughout America.

The public is always welcome to this drug, alcohol, tobacco, and pet free event. Admission to the Paradise Pow Wow is free, although donations are accepted at the gate and information booth.

Over 50 tribal drummers and dancers will be on hand. For the fifth year the Master of Ceremonies will be Val Shadowhawk, who directs the activities in the Arena. Val displays exceptional skill in explaining, to all visitors, the history and meaning of all drumming and dancing to those gathered in the Arena.

David Wilson Jr. is the Arena Director. Head Man Dancer is Myron Horse and Head Woman Dancer is Eileen Myria Casada. Host Northern Drum is Northern Eagle. The Host Southern Drums will be Southern Brothers from Sacramento. Other great Drums will be on hand.

The Grand Entry, each day, will honor all Veterans and Elders present and will begin at Noon.

Dancing in the Arena will include: fun games for small children; Special dances; Fancy shawl dancers; and dances where all present are welcome to join in.

Vendors from near and far will be present on Heritage Trail displaying and selling items such as: woven baskets; hand-made jewelry; Beaders and beads; hand-made flutes; CD's; other Artisans will be on hand as well.

Of course, Indian Tacos and Fry Bread will be for sale along with soda, water and other snacks.

Tribes represented will include: Cherokee; Chippewa; Cree; Blackfoot; Shawnee; Lakota; Ute; Pomo; Apache; Local Maidu tribes and many others.

Proceeds from the event will be donated to the Katie Marie Prosser Foundation which supports Native American students at Butte College and Chico State University entering the medical field. This fall two scholarships will be given to deserving students.

Should anyone care to donate to this foundation, the funds are administered by the North Valley Community Foundation. You may also donate at the Pow Wow, anytime at the Gold Nugget Museum. The money collected will be forwarded to the NVCF.





Natural Tips to Keep Gardeners Healthy

(StatePoint) More than 41,200 people across the nation were injured in 2012 while working in their gardens, reports the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission. Conversely, many common flowers and plants have healing properties that can help gardeners treat their injuries.

• Sore, Stiff Muscles: For gardeners suf-

fering back and knee injuries, Arnica montana can be an essential gardening tool.

Commonly known as the Mountain daisy, Arnica's healing properties were first recognized in the 16th century. Legend has it mountain climbers chewed the plant to relieve sore, aching muscles and bruises from falls. Today, this homeopathic medicine is used by professional athletes and surgeons for muscle pain and stiffness, swelling from injuries and bruising. For more information visit www.Arnicare. com.

• Sunburn, Blisters and Other Skin Conditions: In its homeopathic form, Calendula (Garden marigold) is one of the most versatile aids for skin irritations. Try a Calendula cream or ointment for blisters and calluses, cuts and scrapes, rashes, and chapped skin caused by wind, dry or cold air, or sun.

Used for centuries as a natural healing and soothing substance, Calendula's wound-healing properties are due to essential oils, saponins, flavonoids and alkaloids. These compounds have skin healing properties.




